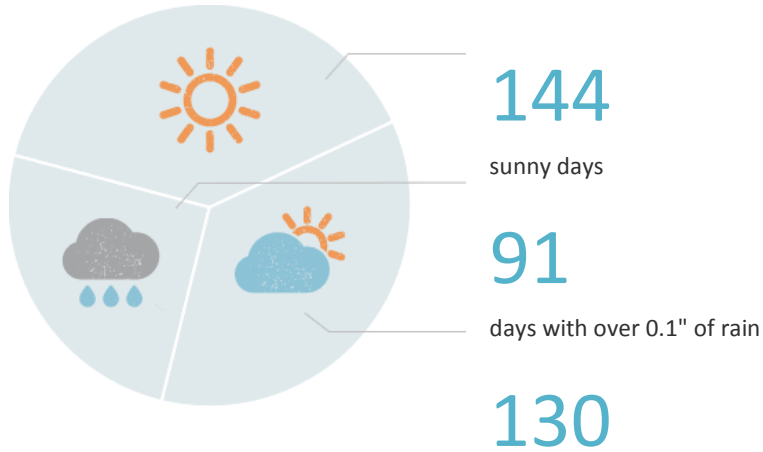
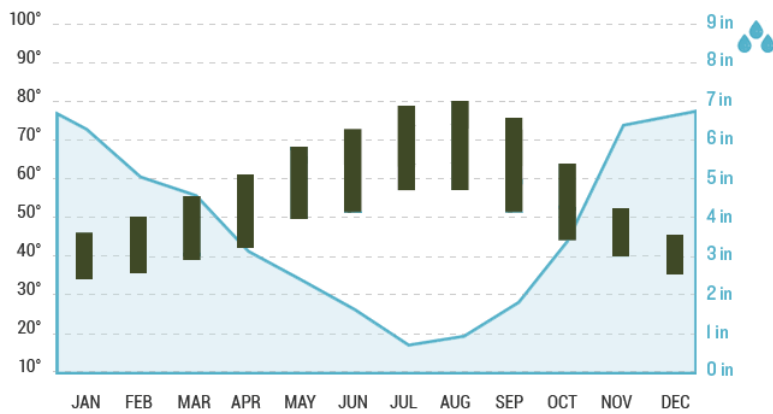


Portland Weather

Portland Weather Glossary

- **mist** – very fine rain, usually occurring overnight and in early morning
“It’s just a little mist; I didn’t even need to put up the hood on my jacket.”
- **drizzle** – misty rain, usually occurring intermittently throughout the day
“Is it raining out?”
“No, just drizzling off and on.”

- **shower** – medium-intensity storm lasting anywhere from 20 minutes to a couple of hours
“This rain shower gives me the perfect excuse to order another pint.”
- **rain** – persistent precipitation that lasts a period of hours
“It looks like rain.”
“Good. I’ve been wanting to check out that great exhibit at the art museum.”

Summer

From July-September, the days are warm (avg. high 78° F) with blissfully low humidity. Rain is rare and the evenings are long: The sun doesn’t set until around 9 p.m. in June and July.

What to pack: Summer attire; light jacket for cooler evenings.

Fall

In October, days tend to be mild and partly sunny as the weather starts to cool, rain becomes more common and the leaves turn. Temperatures — and rain — both fall in November and December.

What to pack: Layers and a rain jacket.

Winter

During the mild winter, high temperatures fall below freezing a few times each year, with rare snowfall. It does rain — but as locals will tell you, rain in Portland means snow on nearby Mount Hood.

What to pack: Coat, fleece, rain-friendly shoes and your ski gear.

Spring

Showers continue in spring, along with plenty of cloud breaks and dry spells. Spring days often start rainy and end up with blue skies and sun. With the temperate climate, many flowers bud in early March.

What to pack: Layers and a light rain jacket.
