

What the Heck is an AHEC?


The Area Health Education Center (AHEC) program was developed by Congress in 1971 to support the recruitment, training and retention a health profession workforce committed to caring for underserved populations in urban and rural communities.

The Oregon AHEC is comprised of a Program Office and five Regional Centers. They collaborate to enhance access to high quality, culturally competent healthcare through:

Develop programming and outreach to introduce secondary and pre-college students statewide to the health career pathway;

Provide community-based interprofessional and interdisciplinary training to prepare health professional students for practice in rural and underserved communities; and

Provide Continuing Education and support for the practicing Oregon medical professionals who precept and help guide learners.



Health Professionals & Health Professions Students

Health Providers

Delivering continuing education and information dissemination programs for health care professionals.

Recent and upcoming offerings include:

- ✓ AHEC Preceptor 6-Session ECHO* to build the capacity of Oregon preceptors to provide high-quality mentorship to healthcare learners.
- Provider Wellness Programming from tendHealth, including: 5-session *Healing In Healthcare During Challenging Times* course, and Wellness Day student intensive.

*ECHO (Extension for Community Healthcare Outcomes), a tele-mentoring program using videoconferencing technology to combine expert presentations with interactive case presentations from participants.

Health Professions Students

Prepare students to provide culturally competent health care to underserved areas and health disparity populations.

AHEC Scholars Program:

- ✓ Community-based experiential training.
- ✓ 422 Oregon health professional learners have participated in the program to date.
- ✓ AHEC Scholar Certification is the prerequisite to qualify for Oregon's Primary Care Loan Forgiveness program.
- ✓ 87% of Scholars plan to work in rural, under-resourced settings.
- Nearly all former scholars now in practice are doing so in medically underserved communities and/or rural settings.

Pathway Programs Around the State





Career Highlights: Pre-recorded interviews with medical professionals working in careers serving the mental health needs of Oregonians - in collaboration with Oregon State Hospital & Oregon State Museum of Mental Health

Service-Learning Projects: Students have the opportunity to work with professionals providing nutrition classes for underrepresented populations, victims of violence, and resources for families. Information available virtually and in person at the Albany Boys and Girls Club. **Health Occupations:** Local high schools job shadow across health system

Diagnosis Day: Rural high school students participate in a hands-on trauma training using a simulation manikin and follow three trauma patients through their care learning about healthcare careers.

Independent Job Shadowing: Students scheduled throughout St. Charles for over 150 hours of shadowing experiences since 2021.

MedStars Camp: In-person Health Occupations week-long camp. Collaboration with Central Oregon Community College.


MedQuest – What is it?

Developed by Northeast Oregon AHEC as early pathway program for rural & underserved high school students in Eastern Oregon

>30-year health career exploration camp serving over 750 students

- Residential camp at Eastern Oregon University in La Grande with cap of 35 participants each year
- Mixture of individually designed job shadows, hands-on activities, and presentations from healthcare providers

Mentorship and linkage between students regionwide



Adapting During the Pandemic


Transformation to virtual camp

>Initial adaptation was quick & utilized local resources

> Camp grew in content, structure, participation with statewide reach in its three years of being virtual.

>There was no cap on participants

Staff received student feedback and adjusted, making improvements to the virtual camp each year







Pandemic Lesson: Equitable Access

- Variety of formats (residential, non-residential, virtual)
- Variety of offerings (during school breaks, summer break, during the school year)
- Variety of locations (urban, frontier, underrepresented minority communities)

Next Steps:

>Using the extension model concept, NEOAHEC's MedQuest will emerge from the Pandemic and its virtual existence to pilot statewide expansion growing the number of sites each year.

➢ Focused growth will occur in underserved and/or underrepresented communities to increase the number of diverse students in the health career pipeline. Sites will be selected based on the ability to contribute to the sustainability of the extension site.
