Interns will start their projects on June 17th and July 1st. They will be on campus Tuesday and Thursday afternoons for didactic experiences, as well as attending and participating in the Thursday Research Conferences. They will work in cubicles on the 4th and 5th floors of the BICC Building.

The program has been funded through different resources over the years. This year, funding will come through two grants:


- Attracting Talented and Diverse Students to Biomedical Informatics and Data Science Careers Through Short-Term Study at OHSU
