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KUDOS

Dr. Cynthia Morris, professor and vice chair in DMICE, and Dr. Terri Hough, chair of the Department of Medicine, have received a five-year U24 grant from NHLBI to serve as the data coordinating center for the Blueprint multi-center, randomized clinical trial. The clinical coordinating center is at Duke University, with Dr. Christopher Cox as PI. Blueprint is an adaptive coping skills training intervention for post-acute care hospitalization for cardiorespiratory patients, which can address psychological distress systems by delivering self-directed, relevant content in a mobile app.

Jennifer Sullivan, a pre-doctoral student in DMICE, teamed up with Susan Hayflick, M.D., Ph.D., professor and chair of molecular and medical genetics and Amanda, McCullough, Ph.D., professor of molecular and medical genetics, earlier this year to create a rare disease student interest group. Dr. Hayflick also recommended a co-leader for the group: Michael Martinez, a student in the Ph.D. Program in Cellular and Molecular Biology. Together, they founded the OHSU group "Students for Rare" in September 2023. The group is connecting labs across campus who previously had no way to collaborate. Vishnu Mohan is pleased to announce that <u>Clinfowiki</u> has reached a major milestone receiving 50 million hits! Clinfowiki is the largest and most-utilized free crowdsourced clinical informatics knowledge base on the internet. It currently has 1581 content pages, and 1474 registered users have contributed to the wiki. There have been 34,592-page edits since the wiki was published, which is a great surrogate measure to indicate that Clinfowiki is a living depository of knowledge that is being actively updated over time.
