Training consists of 3 components

Clinical commitment: Fellows are expected to work 56 clinical hours per month as Emergency Medicine attendings at learner staffed Emergency Departments.

Didactic component: Fellows typically complete masters-level coursework in health professions education research, as well as formal training in education theory and methods.

Administration: The fellowship includes an experiential component that allows the fellow to function in a leadership role, and is actively involved in student and residency teaching and assessment, curriculum development, program evaluation, and simulation education.
