Where do our Medical Toxicology Fellowship graduates go after completing Medical Toxicology Fellowship at OHSU and Oregon Poison Control Center?

About 2/3 of our graduates go on to teaching jobs in academic departments throughout the country, including four who have become Poison Center Medical Directors. The other 1/3 have taken community medicine jobs in their primary specialty (Emergency Medicine) and remain active in bedside toxicology and/or Poison Centers.

The Department of Emergency Medicine Medical Toxicology Fellowship uses a combination of didactic teaching, bedside consultation, and Poison Control Center consultation to meet the core of its educational goals and prepare Fellows for board certification.



Overview

The Medical Toxicology Fellowship Program is a two-year training program for physicians who have completed a U.S. residency in Emergency Medicine. All fellows must be able to work clinically as an attending physician in the United States to be eligible for this fellowship. The program prepares the fellow for board certification in Medical Toxicology. The goals of the fellowship are to provide an excellent experience in a broad range of areas related to medical toxicology and to facilitate in-depth training in an area of emphasis chosen by the Fellow. Major areas of emphasis include acute care medical toxicology, occupational

and environmental toxicology and public health/ health policy issues in toxicology. Within a chosen area of emphasis, training prepares the Medical Toxicology Fellow for future leadership in related research, education and policymaking.

Fellows achieve competency and board qualification through ongoing clinical teaching, topical reviews and formal curriculum.

Applicants should have completed an Accreditation Council for Graduate Medical Education (ACGME) Emergency Medicine residency program. Applications are currently being accepted for 2024-2025.

Our Medical Toxicology fellowship utilizes ERAS to receive and review applications to the program.
