CORE ROTATIONS – 45 CREDITS

Emergency Medicine - This four-week rotation provides experiential educational opportunities that apply the knowledge and skills acquired during the didactic phase of the program to the provision of patient care in an emergency medicine health discipline. Working under the supervision of a licensed clinical preceptor, the student will learn and develop the discipline-specific principles and practices inherent to emergency medicine. The student will develop proficiency in obtaining the medical history, performing physical exams, developing a differential diagnosis, designing a therapeutic management plan, performing clinical procedures, and providing patient education. These skills are grounded in scientific evidence and accurate clinical judgment. In addition, the student will continue to develop effective communication skills and professional behaviors and attributes. (5 Credits)

Surgery - This rotation provides experiential educational opportunities that apply the knowledge and skills acquired during the didactic phase of the program to the provision of patient care in surgical medicine. Clinical experiences occur in both the outpatient ambulatory and inpatient hospital settings and include pre-operative, intra-operative, and post-operative patient encounters. Working under the supervision of a licensed clinical preceptor, the student will learn and develop the discipline-specific principles and practices inherent to surgical medicine. The student will develop proficiency in obtaining the medical history, performing physical exams, developing a differential diagnosis, designing a therapeutic management plan, performing clinical procedures, assisting in surgical procedures, and providing patient education. These skills are grounded in scientific evidence and accurate clinical judgment. In addition, the student will continue to develop effective communication skills and professional behaviors and attributes. (5 Credits)

Inpatient Internal Medicine - This four-week rotation provides experiential educational opportunities that apply the knowledge and skills acquired during the academic year of the program to the provision of patient care in an inpatient internal medicine health discipline. Working under the supervision of a licensed clinical preceptor, the student will learn and develop the discipline-specific principles and practices inherent to inpatient internal medicine. The student will develop proficiency in obtaining the medical history, performing physical exams, developing a differential diagnosis, designing a therapeutic management plan, performing clinical procedures, and providing patient education. These skills are grounded in scientific evidence and accurate clinical judgment. In addition, the student will continue to develop effective communication skills and professional behaviors and attributes. (5 Credits)

Pediatrics - This four-week rotation provides experiential educational opportunities that apply the knowledge and skills acquired during the academic year of the program to the provision of patient care in a pediatric medicine health discipline. Working under the



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supervision of a licensed clinical preceptor, the student will learn and develop the discipline-specific principles and practices inherent to pediatric medicine. The student will develop proficiency in obtaining the medical history, performing physical exams, developing a differential diagnosis, designing a therapeutic management plan, performing clinical procedures, and providing patient education for infant, child, and adolescent patients. These skills are grounded in scientific evidence and accurate clinical judgment. In addition, the student will continue to develop effective communication skills and professional behaviors and attributes. (5 Credits)

Obstetrics & Gynecology - This four-week rotation provides experiential educational opportunities that apply the knowledge and skills acquired during the academic year of the program to the provision of patient care in obstetrics and gynecology. Working under the supervision of a licensed clinical preceptor, the student will learn and develop the discipline-specific principles and practices inherent to obstetrics and gynecology to include prenatal and acute, chronic, and preventive gynecologic patient care. The student will develop proficiency in obtaining the medical history, performing physical exams, developing a differential diagnosis, designing a therapeutic management plan, performing clinical procedures, and providing patient education for prenatal and gynecologic patients. These skills are grounded in scientific evidence and accurate clinical judgment. In addition, the student will continue to develop effective communication skills and professional behaviors and attributes. (5 Credits)

Primary Care I - This four-week rotation provides experiential educational opportunities that apply the knowledge and skills acquired during the academic year of the program to the provision of patient care in primary care. Working under the supervision of a licensed clinical preceptor, the student will learn and develop the discipline-specific principles and practices inherent to primary care. The student will develop proficiency in obtaining the medical history, performing physical exams, developing a differential diagnosis, designing a therapeutic management plan, performing clinical procedures, and providing patient education. These skills are grounded in scientific evidence and accurate clinical judgment. In addition, the student will continue to develop effective communication skills and professional behaviors and attributes. *(5 Credits)*

Primary Care II - This four-week rotation provides experiential educational opportunities that apply the knowledge and skills acquired during the academic year of the program to the provision of patient care in primary care. Working under the supervision of a licensed clinical preceptor, the student will learn and develop the discipline-specific principles and practices inherent to primary care. The student will develop proficiency in obtaining the medical history, performing physical exams, developing a differential diagnosis, designing a therapeutic management plan, performing clinical procedures, and providing patient education. These skills are grounded in scientific evidence and accurate clinical judgment.



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In addition, the student will continue to develop effective communication skills and professional behaviors and attributes. (5 Credits)

Family Medicine - This four-week rotation provides experiential educational opportunities that apply the knowledge and skills acquired during the academic year of the program to the provision of patient care in outpatient family medicine. Working under the supervision of a licensed clinical preceptor, the student will learn and develop the discipline-specific principles and practices inherent to outpatient family medicine. The student will develop proficiency in obtaining the medical history, performing physical exams, developing a differential diagnosis, designing a therapeutic management plan, performing clinical procedures, and providing patient education. These skills are grounded in scientific evidence and accurate clinical judgment. In addition, the student will continue to develop effective communication skills and professional behaviors and attributes. (5 Credits)

Behavioral Medicine - This four-week rotation provides experiential educational opportunities that apply the knowledge and skills acquired during the academic year of the program to the provision of patient care in a behavioral and mental health discipline. Working under the supervision of a licensed clinical preceptor, the student will learn and develop the discipline-specific principles and practices inherent to behavioral and mental health. The student will develop proficiency in obtaining the medical history, performing physical exams, developing a differential diagnosis, designing a therapeutic management plan, performing clinical procedures, and providing patient education. These skills are grounded in scientific evidence and accurate clinical judgment. In addition, the student will continue to develop effective communication skills and professional behaviors and attributes. (5 Credits)
