Whale Watching on the Oregon Coast, December 27-31

Trained Oregon State Park volunteers will be stationed at 15 sites along the Oregon Coar from 10 a.m. to 1 p.m. to help visitors spot gray whales on their southward migration to the calving lagoons in Mexico. The sites are some of the best places to watch for whales on the Oregon Coast. A map of volunteer-staffed sites is available online at the official event webpage.

Oregon Parks Parking

The day-use parking fee will increase from \$5 to \$10 per day at the 25 <u>Oregon State</u> <u>Parks</u> that currently charge for parking starting Jan. 2, 2025. The 12-month and 24-month permits will remain the same price in 2025.

The permits cost \$30 for 12 months and \$50 for 24 months. Visitors can get a \$5 discou on the 12-month permit for the month of December as part of Oregon State Parks' annu sale. Only 25 of the more than 250 Oregon State Parks currently require a day-use parking permit. The fee helps pay for operations and maintenance.
