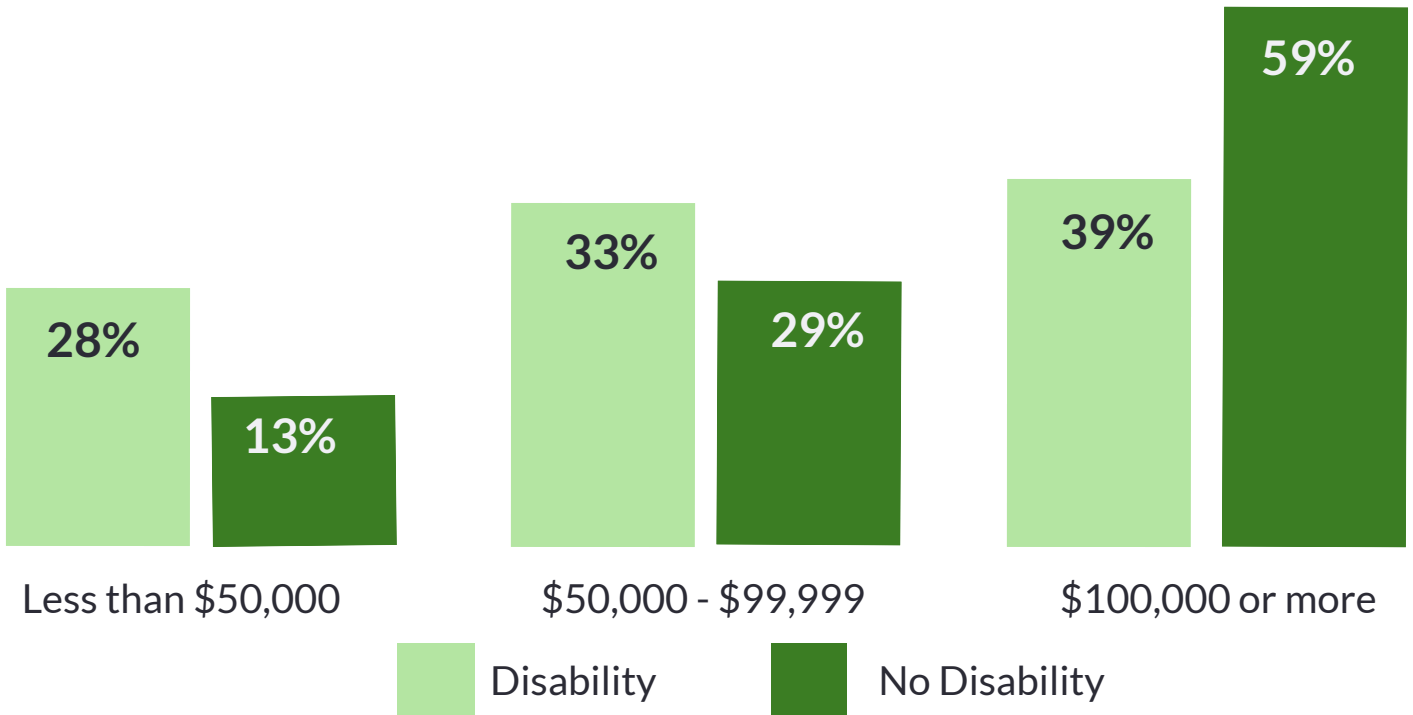


Pay Differences Between Adults With and Without Disabilities in Oregon

In Oregon, adults with disabilities who work for wages or are self-employed have significantly lower incomes than working adults without disabilities.
